


The Smear

What is the smear test?

The smear test (cervical screening) is a check to see if your **cervix** is healthy



- A plastic device called the speculum gently opens the vagina to access the cervix
- Swab is inserted to **collect** cervical cells
- Cell sample is sent to be investigated
- Results are sent back to you

Why you?



If you are aged **25 to** 64 you will be offered a regular smear test

Why is it important?

It helps detect early signs of cervical cancer

You may not have any signs but it is better to **check early**



Skirts or dresses can be left on once you have removed your underwear!





You can ask the nurse to use a smaller speculum!
